Charles Sturt Fencing Club Flag Policy



Summary

Charles Sturt Fencing Club is proud to have had members from over fifty countries fence and train at our club. To show our appreciation and celebrate this diversity, Charles Sturt Fencing Club proudly displays the flags for each of these countries.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidance on which members are eligible to have the flag for their country of birth displayed, where they were not born in Australia, and which flag will be displayed for that country.

Eligibility

Any person, whether member or non-member, who fences at the club at least once, and was born overseas, shall be eligible to have the flag of their birth country displayed.

Flag Selection

Some countries have had different flags over the years. Where the country of birth for the eligible member has had more than one official flag, then the flag as recognised by the United Nations is the one that shall be displayed.

Exceptions

Where the member requests that an alternative flag be displayed for their country then Charles Sturt Fencing Club may, at its discretion, choose to display the alternative flag. In such cases, Charles Sturt Fencing Club's decision about which flag shall be displayed is final.

Non-allowed Flags

Flags that are considered offensive, culturally insensitive, racist, discriminatory, vilifies any segment of the broader community, or is otherwise banned, will not be displayed. In these circumstances, Charles Sturt Fencing Club's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered in to.
